

Hello! Thanks for joining us for the second edition of the Camden Life Center newsletter, created to help keep you up to date on all the latest happenings with programs and services now offered in Camden. We have greatly appreciated your response to our newsletter AND to our services.

We <u>continue to operate at 40 Main Street</u> awaiting the completion of our new building at 20 Main Street. Progress at 20 Main continues at an exciting pace! Office painting is slated to start on November 28th followed by flooring and ceilings installation the following week. It's been an amazing experience to watch this building come together and we cannot wait for all the great things that will happen within these walls.

History

Many have asked about the origins of the Camden Life Center. As you learned in our last edition, the Camden Life Center is a partnership between Come to the Table Counseling & Center for Family Life and Recovery. The primary goal is to inspire hope, provide help, promote wellness and transform lives in the Camden area. The initial dream and beginning steps of the Life Center began in December 2019 when friends decided to purchase 40 Main Street and offer the office space to Come to the Table Counseling to expand needed community services. No one could have anticipated that a conversation among friends about creating one building that houses "everything for real life" (#reallife) would grow and expand so quickly. Within two years and with partnerships with CareNet of CNY, AmeriCorps and Insights of Helio Health, the need for a new building quickly became a pressing issue. Enter – the Community Foundation and Center for Family Life and Recovery.

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Food \$en\$e

Food \$en\$e is a monthly food buying co-op for anyone who wants to stretch their grocery dollars. Food \$en\$e provides a monthly box of 12-15 grocery items at a discounted price.

Monthly Package- \$20.50 A sample food box includes:

- 4-5 meat items like chicken, ground beef, and fish
- 4-5 staple items like pasta and rice
- 4-5 fresh produce items like carrots or oranges

Monthly specials like stuffed pork chops, American cheese, meatballs, and chicken tenders can be purchased in addition to the box.

HEAP opens **November 1, 2022** for the 2022-2023 heating season: **What is HEAP?**

The Home Energy Assistance
Program (HEAP) can help eligible
New Yorkers heat and cool their
homes. If you are eligible, you may
receive one regular HEAP benefit
per program year and could also be
eligible for emergency HEAP
benefits if you are in danger of
running out of fuel or having your
utility service shut off.
Questions regarding the HEAP
program should be directed to our
